New USI classification code

Courses delivered in a single day have been exempt from the Unique Student Identifier (USI) scheme since its inception and this exemption has now been extended to 2017.

NCVER recently updated the [AVETMISS Data element definitions: edition 2.2](#) with a new classification code “SHORT” in the Unique student identifier data element to accommodate the extension, as well as the tightening of validation rules for this data element. The “SHORT” value will be required for AVETMISS submissions with a collection year of 2017 or following. RTOs accessing this exemption in 2016 must leave the USI code blank in their 2016 AVETMISS submissions.

Please note, RTOs must report a USI provided to them, even if the course was delivered in a single day. Additionally, if a client does not provide a USI, RTOs must advise them that their training will not appear on their USI transcript.
