## Headlines on qualifications

Outcome	Completers	Part-completers
Achieved main reason for training	87.4%	77.0%
Improved employment status	64.4%	56.0%
Commenced further study after training	33.3%	22.4%
Satisfied with quality of training	89.5%	77.8%
Of those employed after training, received at least one job-related benefit	80.4%	71.1%

Qualification completers: students who completed a training package qualification or an accredited qualification.


Qualification part-completers: students who enrolled in but only completed part of a training package qualification or an accredited qualification (and are no longer undertaking that training).




## Improved employment status after training and seasonally adjusted unemployment rate, 2019-2024 (%)






## Qualification completers – commenced further study after training and improved employment status for top qualification enrolments, 2024 (%)



### Outcomes for two training packages, 2024 (%)








### Difference in outcomes between qualification completers and partcompleters, 2024 (%)






## Qualification part-completers' main reason for discontinuing training by funding source, 2024 (%)
